

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN  
YORK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE  
AND  
UNIVERSITY OF MAINE AT FORT KENT**

York County Community College (YCCC) and the University of Maine at Fort Kent (UMFK) hereby enter into this articulation agreement to facilitate transfer of YCCC students or graduates of the Associate in Applied Science degree in Criminal Justice to UMFK's Bachelor of Science in Rural Public Safety Administration online degree program. This agreement enumerates the conditions and procedures for YCCC students to transfer to UMFK. The information included in this agreement is effective on the date of signatures by both institutional designees for an ongoing period until one or both institutions choose to terminate the agreement.

To best serve the needs of YCCC students considering transfer to UMFK; to facilitate the transfer process; and to ensure that students are provided the information they need, it is agreed that:

1. UMFK will accept as junior graduates of the Associate of Applied Science in Criminal Justice at YCCC into the Bachelor's of Rural Public Safety Administration, as amended on the basis of the courses and credits outlined in this agreement.
2. Awarding of the UMFK degree requires successful completion of all pertinent academic degree requirements.
3. The UMFK application fee is waived for YCCC graduates entering under this agreement.
4. While matriculation and degree candidacy are offered through this agreement, all YCCC graduates must complete an application, submit an official copy of their transcript, and meet all admissions requirements of the UMFK baccalaureate degree programs.
5. Each institution shall retain complete responsibility for, and control and authority over, its own curriculum, programs, policies, standards, admission criteria, facilities, employees, and students.
6. This agreement may be modified or amended only in writing and signed by both parties.
7. This agreement may be terminated by both parties or by either party upon sixty (60) days of written notice to the other party.
8. In the event that this agreement is modified, amended or terminated, the students who have been admitted to or entered either institution under the existing program shall be able to finish the program under the same terms and conditions that existed when they were admitted to the program.
9. Upon request, UMFK agrees to provide follow-up data to YCCC on the preparation and performance of its graduates.
10. YCCC agrees to publicize the opportunities of this agreement and distribute marketing brochures and information about UMFK's program to the admissions and the transfer and career services staff.
11. This agreement will be in force as long as both institutions maintain the course structure or equivalency as outlined in the agreement.
12. This agreement will be reviewed annually.
13. The below-named institutions agree to abide by the transfer agreement set forth.






