



Articulation Agreement

Southern New Hampshire University and York County Community College

I. PURPOSE

Southern New Hampshire University (SNHU) and York County Community College (YCCC), in the spirit of academic cooperation, and in order to facilitate the transfer of graduates of YCCC to SNHU, hereby do enter into an academic articulation agreement. Successful implementation of the Agreement is dependent upon communication of its content to all involved participants and the assumption of responsibility by both institutions for such communications.

The purpose of this Articulation Agreement is to acknowledge that, following completion of an associate degree at YCCC, students may transfer all the credits from the degree outlined below to a Southern New Hampshire University bachelor degree program that coincides with their associate degree so long as the following criteria are met.

This Articulation Agreement, finalized on June 7, 2017, by and between Southern New Hampshire University and YCCC is as follows:

II. TRANSFER PATHWAY(S)

1. Based on the course equivalency table attached to this agreement, SNHU will honor the transfer of credits outlined in the following YCCC associate degree to its' corresponding SNHU bachelor degree:

AA Liberal Studies to School of Arts and Sciences 4-year Bachelor Degrees AA Liberal Studies to School of Business 4-year Bachelor Degrees

2. As SNHU and YCCC are regionally accredited, all academic course work in which a student has earned a grade of "C-" or higher is fully transferable based on the attached course equivalencies. Military students may submit a Joint Services transcript for additional credit consideration. Students may transfer up to 90 credits towards an SNHU bachelor degree program.
3. Credits used to complete requirements for an YCCC associate degree may not be applied a second time toward courses in the bachelor degree if it is included in the transfer of credit as part of this agreement.

III. TERMS

1. Southern New Hampshire University agrees to provide YCCC upon request, on official letterhead, an update of student enrollment and academic progress, to include general data on how many students have transferred to Southern New Hampshire University, completed at least three terms and are making satisfactory academic progress through their program (as defined in the SNHU catalog).
2. This Agreement is effective as of the date of the fully executed document, and shall continue until terminated. Both parties must notify of curriculum changes impacting this agreement. Either party may terminate the Agreement without cause upon 90 days written notice to the other party. Notwithstanding the foregoing, either party may terminate the Agreement immediately in the event that participation under the Agreement may give rise to a violation of any requirement of federal or state law or regulation or the requirements of any accrediting agency having jurisdiction.
3. Admission criteria, academic requirements, and other admission requirements will be subject to the applicable Catalog at the time of the students' admission to their desired SNHU bachelor program. Students following a guide are *highly* encouraged to work with the Office of Transfer Admission to ensure the student is locked into the catalog year of the guide they are following
4. The parties grant to each other a non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use each other's trademarks and servicemarks in furtherance of the articulation coordination detailed herein or in a manner solely for the purpose of identifying and communicating the existence of the relationship to YCCC students and alumni. Use of trademarks, servicemarks and logos will comply with use policies of the originating institution. The parties shall discontinue the use of the licensed marks and return any and all files and materials containing the licensed marks supplied by the owner at termination or expiration of the Agreement. Neither party grants to the other any interest in the other party's trademarks. Should either originating institution request, in writing, that a particular use of the originating institution's trademarks and/or servicemarks be discontinued, the non-originating institution shall cease and desist such use of the trademarks and/or servicemarks.
5. YCCC agrees to regularly communicate information regarding this articulation arrangement to its students and to host SNHU representatives on campus for recruitment activities, to include classroom visits, during the academic year.
6. This Agreement may be executed by a duly authorized representative of each party, either by electronic or facsimile transmission, each of which will be considered an original.
7. This Articulation Agreement is based on the current curriculum of both educational institutions. Each institution is responsible for notifying the other of any substantive changes to the curriculum. This agreement shall be reviewed by both institutions every four years.
8. The official, signed document, stamped "ORIGINAL" is to be filed in the VPAA office, and signed copies will be distributed to appropriate parties.
