Dear YCCC Community,

Out of an abundance of caution, I am writing to inform you that a visitor to campus who attended a short meeting on campus on Monday, March 9, during the college's spring break, notified us this morning that they tested positive for the coronavirus (COVID-19).

The individual did not have symptoms of the virus (fever, cough, shortness of breath) while on campus. The individuals who attended the meeting have been notified.

The CDC advises that if you are concerned that you might have been exposed to COVID-19 you should monitor your health for fever, cough and shortness of breath, and call your healthcare provider for medical advice.
