

The first year before FAFSA got involved, we had a lengthy process to take students into the program:

Criteria for selecting students for Future for ME
Scholarship for Precision Machining Certificate

1. York County high school senior
2. Application and acceptance into Precision Machining Certificate
3. Teacher references to substantiate student's commitment to completing the certificate and or verify student's prior background.
4. Interview with student to complete scholarship application-What rules in or what rules out?
 - a. Be able to enroll in Fall/Spring semesters
 - b. Understand that completion of five courses in two semesters (? About extending beyond)
 - c. Maintain 2.0 GPA by end of FALL semester to receive scholarship for SPRING
 - d. Other??
 - e. What experience do you have in Precision Machining?
 - f. What would someone say are your best qualities?
 - g. What would you do with the certificate?
 - h. Where would you want to work?
 - i. Would you want to start immediately with the certificate, or would you consider pursuing the degree on your own?
 - j. Complete the 2018-19 FAFSA, and have unmet need based on that data.
 - k. Complete the Precision Machining Certificate courses in 1 year.
 - l. Student may receive up to \$3,000.00 a year towards tuition fees, books, and supplies.
 - m. Funding for this scholarship program ends June 30, 2019.**
