






**Transfer Memorandum of Understanding
Between
Husson University
And
York County Community College**

Statement of Purpose
Husson University and York County Community College (YCCC) have entered into this transfer memorandum of understanding (MOU). The purpose of this MOU is to facilitate student academic transfer and provide a smooth transition from a two-year college to a university. It is recognized that this MOU shall describe the required program of study at YCCC for admission eligibility to Husson University.

Terms and Conditions of Academic Credit Transfer
To: Bachelor of Science programs (as referenced in Appendix B)
From: Associate of Science programs (as referenced in Appendix B)
The evaluation and transfer of earned college credits shall be in compliance with state and federal education policies and institutional and academic program accreditation standards pertaining to undergraduate academic transfer. Current students and graduates who have earned degrees from YCCC shall be eligible for credit evaluation under the terms of this MOU.
Transfer students will be accorded the same standards and criteria for admission to a major degree sequence as Husson University students. All applicants accepted to Husson University's Baccalaureate programs must fulfill the graduation requirements of the granting institution as identified in Appendices A & B.

MOU Implementation and Agreement Review
The Chief Academic Officer designee of *the collaborating institutions* shall be responsible for implementing this MOU, for identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent MOUs, and for conducting a *periodic review of this MOU*.

APPENDIX A

This MOU includes specific requirements for admission into a program, outlines requirements, and indicates which degree or diploma can be used to meet program prerequisites as well as general education, major or program, and graduation requirements.

Admissions requirements:

High school transcript; college transcript(s); military transcripts (if applicable); appropriate immunizations; application form with DOEL or Day division

Transfer policy:


- Transfer of credits earned at the granting institution will be considered according to schedules in Appendix B
- All grades in classes to be transferred must be a "C" or better, unless an A.S. degree is obtained from YCCC in Accounting, then all grades in AC courses must be a "C" or better and grades in any other classes must be passing
- Students from YCCC transferring to Husson University under advanced standing, based on the quality of their credentials, must request an official transcript be sent to Husson University Admissions. Each transcript will be evaluated individually based upon grades and existing transfer agreements between Husson University and YCCC. Transfer students and Husson University students will be held to the same standards and criteria for admission. Upon transfer, any outstanding requirements at Husson University must be completed.

At least fifteen (15) credits must be earned in Husson Criminal Justice courses.
