4. Apply prewriting strategies to start the writing process – narrowing a topic, brainstorming, outlining and deciding on an effective rhetorical strategy. (1)
5. Demonstrate revision strategies to enhance written communication such as grammar, tone, structure, mechanics, punctuation and organization (2,4)
6. Verify and analyze answer by employing critical thinking skills and logical tests in mathematics and science.
7. Demonstrate college-level literacy skills for writing, reading, computers and mathematics (1,2,6)
8. Solve mathematical problems by applying mathematical thinking, previously learned math skills and quantitative analysis in math and related disciplines. (2,4)
