YCCC'S NURSING PROGRAM will prepare individuals to become registered nurses at the Associate Degree level. The curriculum will blend Nursing courses with general education courses to provide a sound theoretical base of nursing practice. Students will participate in clinical and classroom experiences during each of the four semesters in the program. Clinical experiences will be offered at hospitals and long-term care facilities located in York County. Upon successful completion of the program, graduates will be eligible to take the NCLEX Registered Nurse (RN) licensure examination.



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Possess a high-school diploma or GED certificate.
- Achieve at least a B- in all prerequisite courses:
 - ◊ Anatomy & Physiology I w/ Lab (BIO126/BIO127)
 - ◊ College Composition (ENG101)
 - ◊ Quantitative Reasoning or Statistics (MAT118 or MAT124)
 - ◊ Introduction to Psychology (PSY 101)
- Additional courses recommended before starting the nursing program:
 - ◊ Psychology Across the Lifespan (PSY210)
 - ◊ Human Anatomy & Physiology II w/Lab (BIO136/BIO137)
 - ◊ Microbiology w/Lab (BIO230/BIO231)
 - ◊ Oral Communications (SPE 101)
 - ◊ General Education Core II (Arts/Humanities)
- Attend a mandatory information session.
- TEAS test score of 60 or higher.

Upon admission to the program, the student will receive an acceptance letter to the Nursing program and will be assigned a nursing faculty advisor.
