YCCC'S NURSING IS A COMPETITIVE PROGRAM WITH 32 SEATS AVAILABLE FOR FALL 2023*

Acceptance into the Nursing program is on a competitive basis. Successful completion of the prerequisites does not guarantee acceptance into the Nursing program. Students who are working on their prerequisites should apply to the Health Studies/Pre-Nursing Program. Upon acceptance into the Nursing program, students will receive an acceptance letter listing their start date, and will be assigned a nursing faculty advisor.

YCCC'S NURSING PROGRAM

This program will prepare individuals to become registered nurses at the Associate Degree level. The curriculum will blend Nursing courses with general education courses to provide a sound theoretical base of nursing practice. Students will participate in clinical and classroom experiences during each of the four semesters in the program. Clinical experiences will be offered at hospitals and long-term care facilities located in York County. Upon successful completion of the program, graduates will be eligible to take the NCLEX Registered Nurse (RN) licensure examination.

PROGRAM LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Provide compassionate nursing care to patients, families, groups, populations, and communities from diverse backgrounds in a variety of settings; care that is age and culturally appropriate and based on a patient's preferences, values and educational needs.
- Communicate effectively and collaborate with diverse patients, families, groups, and members of the health care team to promote shared-decision making.
- Utilize information and patient care technology to manage care, support decision-making, minimize error while employing effective use of resources.
- Evaluate and integrate current evidence with clinical judgment to provide safe, quality care.
- Integrate professional behaviors and leadership skills in the provision of professional nursing care delivery.
- Use quality measures and indicators to evaluate patient outcomes and the effect of changes in the delivery of care.

Math and Science prerequisites must be completed within seven years (January 1, 2016 to January 31, 2023) TEAS test scores must be from within the past 3 years (Feb. 2020 to Feb. 2023). All prerequisites for Fall 2023 applicants need to be completed by January 31, 2023. Applicants are responsible for ensuring all pre-requisites are appropriately met.
