### What to Bring:

- Unofficial YCCC transcript (you can print one from the myYCCC portal)
- Other college transcripts (these can be unofficial as well)
  - Even though a course may have transferred to YCCC, it may not to another college
- Questions!
  - Spend a little time thinking about what you'd like to get out of the meeting (beforehand)
  - Also spend some time researching the college and major(s) on their website (it might answer some simpler questions leaving more time for the complicated ones)
- Something to take notes on and with

### What to Expect:

- Each appointment is for 30 minutes
- Appointments are held in the Transfer Office (down the hall from the Bookstore)
- You can utilize this time to:
  - Ask questions about the college in general (location, culture, students, etc.)
  - Ask questions about specific programs
  - An unofficial transcript review to assess what courses will transfer from YCCC to this college\*
  - Advice on what courses would be best to take at YCCC to maximize your eligible transfer credits\*

*\*A final determination of courses/credits will be made at the time of admission. This often involves the Admissions Office and the Faculty of your intended major. It's a good idea to also contact the department of your major after this meeting to see if there is any additional information or considerations you should be thinking about or planning on.*

### Other good Transfer tips:

- Keep copies of all of your syllabi (they may be needed for a course credit evaluation)
- Different colleges have different requirements, even with core classes
- Most colleges only accept credit for grades of C or above (some programs are stricter)
- Certain majors can be tougher to get into or may only start at one time of year
- Final cost depends on many things: % of student need met by the college, scholarships, travel costs
