

## PROGRAM TRANSFER AGREEMENT

This PROGRAM TRANSFER AGREEMENT (“Agreement”) is made and entered into this \_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_ by and between the **University of New England**, along with its College of Arts and Sciences (collectively referred to as the “University”), and **York County Community College** (“College”).

WHEREAS, both parties desire to provide the means for a smooth transition for students who have satisfactorily completed the rigorous and mutually agreed upon program at the College and are eligible for admission to the University’s College of Arts & Sciences,

WHEREAS, the parties desire to implement the provisions of the Articulation Agreement to include specific requirements for admission into a program, outlines course list requirements, and indicates which degree or diploma can be used to meet program prerequisites.

NOW, THEREFORE, subject to the terms, conditions, and provisions of the Articulation Agreement as amended or replaced from time to time, the parties mutually agree as follows:

**1. Programs:**

The College’s Associate in Arts, Associate in Applied Science, and Associate in Science degrees can be used to meet the University program prerequisites for the various degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science in the University’s College of Arts and Sciences.

**2. Admissions Requirements:**

- a. Successful completion of the College’s Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree.
- b. Achievement of 2.0 or better GPA.
- c. Submission of a completed application, \$40 application fee, all official college/university transcripts, official high school transcript with SAT/ACT scores (if applicant has less than 24 college credits).
- d. Essays and recommendations are recommended, but not required.

**3. Course List Requirements:**

- e. Course Requirements for the University’s Degree are set forth in Appendix B in order to transfer courses as part of the degree at the University.
- f. Mapping of Remaining Courses for University’s Degree are set forth in Appendix C to complete the degree at the University.

**4. Program Contact Information:**


- a. The College’s Program contact shall be its Academic Dean or designee.
- b. The University’s Program contact shall be its Dean of the University’s College of Arts and Sciences or designee.

**5. General Provisions:**


- a. Term: The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years from the date of execution (“Initial Term”). It shall thereafter be automatically renewed for one term of three (3) years, provided that either party may provide the other written notice of non-renewal not less than three (3) months prior to the expiration of the Initial Term.
- b. Termination of Program Transfer Agreement: This Agreement may be terminated by either party with ninety (90) days’ prior written notice to the other party. This Agreement will automatically terminate upon the termination or expiration of the Articulation Agreement.
- c. Entire Agreement/Amendment: This Agreement and the Articulation Agreement constitute the entire understanding between the parties with respect to the identified subject matter, and no prior or contemporaneous agreement, written or oral, will be effective to vary the terms of these agreements. No amendment to either agreement will be effective unless reduced to writing and signed by an authorized representative of each party.


