- A licensed veterinarian or a credentialed veterinary technician with an earned credential from an AVMA or CVMA accredited program.
- A minimum of three years' work experience as a veterinarian or a veterinary technician; or a closely related field.
- College level teaching experience that includes a demonstrated commitment to teaching excellence and improving student learning.



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PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- An earned master's degree from an accredited institution in a related discipline or education for veterinary technicians.
- Recent college level teaching experience at a community college.
- Knowledge of various learning styles, experience using instructional technology in the classroom and experience with online learning management systems.

SALARY AND BENEFITS:

Starting salary including a full benefits package will be in accordance with the Maine Educational Association (MEA) Faculty contract. Benefits include 100% employer paid health, dental and life insurance for employees (spouse/domestic partner/dependent coverage also available), vision insurance, choice of Maine Public Employees Retirement System or TIAA CREF in lieu of social security, generous vacation/personal/sick time allowances, 12 paid holidays, professional development, and free tuition within the MCCS for employees, spouse and/or dependents.
