What to know...

As the <u>leaves turn bright color and fall from the trees</u> and the nights get cooler in October, everyone no matter <u>how stubborn</u>, has to face the <u>facts of heating</u> their dwelling. <u>Heating and energy costs</u> have skyrocketed making <u>conservation of resources</u> more crucial to limiting the <u>overall burden on your wallet</u>. There are some ways <u>to conserve</u> <u>heat and save around the house</u> that may seem minimal but can add up over the winter.

- <u>Insulation-</u> keeping the heat in whether attic, walls or floors
- Use the <u>Sun</u>-Open the curtains on sunny days and close them at night to maximize efficiency.
- Buy an energy efficient <u>space heater</u> for larger rooms
- Reverse your <u>ceiling fans</u>
- <u>Seal</u> up your doors and windows
- Replace <u>the filters</u> on your heating units
