Welcome To Housing Home Goods Bank Open House, Saturday October 15th 9:00am-12:00 Noon

Welcome To Housing Home Goods Bank, Inc. (WTH) will be hosting an Open House at their warehouse at 333 Main Street in Old Town, Maine from 9:00am to 12:00 Noon on Saturday, October 15th. Founder Chris Olsen says he and the volunteers who keep the All Volunteer program "going" and "growing" are looking forward to the event for a number of reasons. This month marks the 11th anniversary of the program which hands out free furniture, home goods and adaptive equipment for free to people through more than 60 different agencies and organizations. WTH serves people starting over from shelter programs, those displaced by disasters like house fires, people escaping domestic violence, immigrants making a new life here in Maine, people re-entering society from corrections, and others including graduates of the Job Corps program. WTH helps individuals, including Veterans and families at no cost and has also helped recovery homes and even shelters with free furniture.

WTH's motto is "Helping people in Need to Succeed," according to Olsen. This month they're having their annual appeal and later this month the program will be receiving a \$15,000 grant check from the Penobscot County Commission. That grant comes from funds given to Penobscot County from the American Rescue Plan Act. WTH was also a recipient of a \$10,000 grant from the Maine Community Foundation to help with operational costs while the program works to build up its annual appeal as the program now owns it's building outright.

In December of last year, thanks to a generous grant from the Stephen and Tabitha King Foundation, Welcome To Housing was able to purchase the 6,400+ square foot house at 333 Main Street from Penobscot Community Health Care who had allowed the pro-gram to be in the building since March of 2017 at no cost. The University of Maine has been very supportive of the program with both classes as well as individual volunteers including intern like Maia Ferguson, who over this summer put together the attached testimonial flyer that gives firsthand accounts about how WTH works and helps people starting over. Although it's an All-Volunteer operation, Olsen says they incur expenses to run the program, especially after acquiring the building and they include:




